
Counselor. Alice is

## **About the Grants**

The Miriam Deisseroth Scholarships - Miriam, a graduate of Linfield College and the University of Idaho, was a treasured member of Windward Oʻahu AAUW and served as president from 1968 to 1970. She came to Hawai'i in 1946, and taught English at Castle High School until retirement. During Miriam's term as president Windward Oʻahu AAUW members did community work and assisted with programs at both Kailua and Castle High School and hosted the Division Convention in Kailua. Miriam was a great supporter of education. During her presidency the first local grants were given in spring of 1970. After Miriam's death in 2004, the Windward Oʻahu
